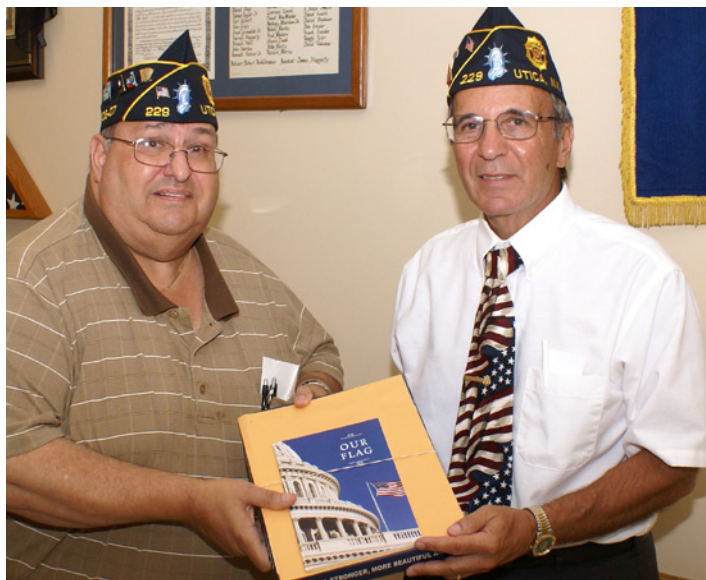
Ages infant to 12 are welcome.

Completing the driver safety course reduces insurance premiums for up to three years.

CENTRAL NY VETERANS EXPO AT SUNYIT OCT. 9

The 6th Annual Central NY Veterans Expo takes place 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 9 at SUNYIT in Marcy.

The event is intended to connect veterans and their families directly to area providers. It is free and open to the public.

The Expo begins with speakers on veterans issues from 9 to 10:30 a.m. in Kunsela Hall, followed at 11 by a service fair in the Campus Center Gymnasium with over 80 local and regional agencies and businesses including the VA and many not-for-profit service providers. Special services for homeless veterans will also be available.

Veterans can register to attend by going to vetexpo.org. Those who register will be eligible to receive a free lunch.
